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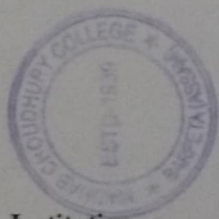

- Need to introduce number of UG, PG, skill oriented and job oriented courses
- Automation and up-gradation of Library with new reference books, e-resources and journals.
- Establish a placement cell and a centre to offer coaching for Competitive exams, Communicative and Competitive skills for the students.
- Establishment of Language laboratory to enhance communication skills.
- Classrooms need to be modernized.
- Laboratory equipment and infrastructure need to be strengthened.
- Implementation of ICT oriented teaching and learning in all departments
- Girls' and Boys' Commons room need to be renovated and augmented with extra toilets facilities
- Girls' hostel needs to be augmented with extra toilets, bath rooms and safe drinking water.
- IQAC needs to be strengthened to reinforce quality initiatives.
- Conducting on-job training programme in Computer and skills for non-teaching staff
- Alumni association may be registered and made proactive
