#### 20. Overall observations and Recommendations

On invitation, the Gauhati University Academic Audit team comprising of three senior Professors visited Madhab Choudhury College, Barpeta on 11th January, 2022 and conducted the first Academic Audit from 9.00 am to 5.30 pm.

#### About the College:

Madhab Choudhury College is located in the heart of Barpeta town, Barpeta district of Assam. It is one of the oldest colleges of Assam established in 1939. In the beginning, it was started as an arts college, affiliated with Calcutta University whereas the science stream was introduced in the year 1959. At present, being an affiliated College under The Gauhati University (since 1948), the college is accommodating around 2460 students per year in 15 subjects in UG Honours/Major/general programmes. Recently, the College received permission to expand academic dimension by opening a few course under UGC's Community College Scheme, PGDCA (Regular), Certificate course of GIS & Remote Sensing under GU, Contact Centre of IDOL (GU) and Study Centre of KKHSOU and offering many computer courses in self-financed mode. The college has already made 2 cycles of NAAC assessment and the latest one was in the year 2015 with a B grade (CGPA 2.51). The college is now preparing for 3rd cycle of NAAC accreditation.

#### Observations and Remarks:

During the visit, the Principal apprised the team on various academic aspects of the College and facilitated the team to visit all departments, centres and facilities. The members had department wise detailed interactions on points necessary for a healthy teaching-learning environment. The Committee's focal points for these interactions were guided by the matrix that will be assessed by NAAC, which the College authority is contemplating to invite shortly. Overall, the Committee is happy to see the positive developments in the College even in the pandemic situation and consequent countrywide lockdown.

Both Arts and Science streams were quite experienced in terms of age. Laboratories are sound and commendable

though little augmentation requied. Out of a total of 64 faculty members, 32 are with Ph. D. degree, and this is about 50% out of the permanent faculty. A few are pursuing, which seems to be a positive sign for the academics of the college.

It is noted with concern that a few Departments are running with limited faculty members against the sanctioned post which need to be strengthened considering the students' enrolment in last three years. It is hoped that the appointments in these Departments shall be made as soon as possible to maintain the proper student teacher ratio.

The College has the provision of recording data on the Class register, student's progression and alumni in each department which the committee feels as good academic practices. The Records submitted by all the departments excluding the History and Geography Departments for the verification of the Committee and the same were duly noted. The record-keeping in few departments found to be poor.

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The Committee has noticed that a few faculty members have publications in high impact factor Journals and UGC CARE listed Journals, which is a good sign. However, the majority of the members' publications are not in quality journals or books. The committee advised against wasting time and energy for the sake of numbers and asked the teachers to publish in standard Journals. Many faculty members are found to be lacking in research enthusiasm. As a result, the Committee recommends submitting research proposals to various funding institutions by the faculty members.

The College conducted many initiatives on faculty development in teaching-learning in the last few years and the teachers are benefited by taking part in such programmes. The college encouraged teachers by awarding travel grant to attend Seminar/Conferences. The initiative of the college authority for awarding a teacher award is an appreciable effort.

The Committee is happy to note that in some departments the pass percentage is more than 80% in Major subjects. A good number of students could secure first class in University examinations from the college, which is laudable. The Committee is worried about the fact that the overall pass percentage in general courses is not satisfactory.

Hardly 55 percentages of the faculty members are interested in the use of ICT, specifically in the use of the internet in teaching-learning. It is also heartening to see that a few faculty members are actively engaged themselves in the preparation of e-contents in the form of PPT and video lectures. These contents are disseminated among the students, which was very helpful during the lockdown period. The Committee only wishes that the contents be upgraded and put in use even if the physical classes resume.

The College campus is having sound internet connectivity with a dedicated leased line which helps the students and teachers in interacting and collating study materials. It is a worthy step as taken by the College authority. The college has four well-equipped Computer labs with dedicated browsing centres for teachers and students. The

college is trying to generate some resources by offering a few self-financing courses.

The College Library has been provided with all modern settings. There are 59,985 books, 36 Periodicals and a Remote Access facility. The library is run on SOUL 2.0 software. Evidence said that the visit by the sudent of the Major courses and, more specifically by the teachers was poor.

Though there were Lesson Plans for each of the courses mandatory for each Departments, few Departments seemed to be ignorant about the Standard Operating Procedures prepared for continuing the teaching-learning process during the recent pandemic and resultant lockdown.

The College and the individual departments use to organise several academic programmes, which is commendable. The College Canteen is good. From the students' welfare side the College has common rooms for boys and girls along with well-laid sports facility. The Committee feels happy to see a well equipped Day Care Centre to be created for the wards of the faculty members. The activities of NSS, Bharat Scouts and NCC Cadets are commendable and authority is in full support of the propagating the activities of the Cadets. These can be treated as one of the best practices of the college for the welfare of students and staff members.

The team prefers to appreciate the Department of Chemistry for good quality publications; Department of Economics for well documentation of the records.

#### Specific Suggestions:

The committee feels it as a duty to offer certain suggestions for the improvement of the academic atmosphere of the college. However, these are not stand-alone; rather, they would be a part of continuous efforts of the faculty members and administration of the college in their relentless pursuit towards achieving the highest academic standard.

- Lesson plans based on the PO-CO matrix for all programmes may be prepared.
- It is suggested to maintain students' progression records along with their performances.
- Efforts may be initiated on an urgent basis for improvement of the pass percentage in general courses (and some Major subjects).
- A database on slow learners may be kept ready. Some more remedial classes/doubt clearing sessions/one-to-one contact counselling may be arranged at a time mutually convenient for faculty and such struggling students. Moreover, there should be active initiatives for identifying the slow learners at the beginning of the session with adequate evidence.
  - Departments may be identified and awarded on the basis of their performances.

- Research works should be promoted among the faculty members and they may be encouraged to publish in more reputed Journals. To create a more conducive publication atmosphere in the college, Best Researcher Awards may be instituted for the faculty members.
- Faculty members may be encouraged to publish more books through peer review mechanism,
- If budget permits every faculty should be allotted a PC with a dedicated LAN connection.
- Students' Satisfaction Survey should be conducted regularly, preferably after completion of each Semester, so that the issues if any, of the previous Semesters could be traced and resolved.
- Though the College has tremendous potential, full dedication is expected from each faculty member to bring laurel to the College.
- Alumni records of each Department should be strengthened.
